#### From Revd Karen

We are entering a really busy time of year when the church calendar says its Advent and we should be pausing, watching and waiting, whilst the reality of preparing for so many services means that I'm permanently meeting myself coming backwards.

I recently went on retreat at Launde Abbey in Leicestershire with the Rural Mission Hub. We are a group of ministers, lay and ordained who are passionate about sharing the love of Christ outside of the towns. It's tough as our denominations can seem to be focused on the urban areas and as ministers we can feel stretched too thin. We are lucky in Gloucestershire. The parish groupings are quite small with up to nine parishes in a benefice. In Leicester Diocese one benefice has twenty parishes and over thirty churches. Their priest was too busy to attend the retreat. We really missed her as the theme of the twenty-four-hour retreat was 'pause.' We were invited to remember that Advent is about pause and to find a place for Jesus in the frantic busyness of November and December. How might you pause this Advent?

#### A look back at November



We had something of a candle theme going in St Edward's! We started with an All Soul's Service – a beautiful reflective experience with Chopin preludes from Adam and poetry from Revd Karen and the opportunity to light a candle to remember a loved one.

Lumos brought their second concert experience to St Edward's Church later in the month. This time it was the music of Hans Zimmer. The church looked stunning with all the candles creating a unique setting for the music on the stage that was built in around an hour. This time there were portable red



lights which were very appropriate for the Feast of Christ the King and might they be available in other liturgical colours? The church was full with 190 tickets sold for one performance and 150 for the second. The music was really well done with pieces from Gladiator, Inception, Interstellar, Madagascar, The Lion King and Pirates of the Caribbean. Lumos have moved from the big churches and cathedrals to medium sized ones this year and it seems to be working well for them and for us. Their musicians love the fact that we turn on the heating for them! Lumos are booked to come back in April, July and October next year.




#### And a look forward to December
